

Our Opening Night film is a stylish musical biopic that explores the life of Brian Epstein, the visionary Jewish manager whose bold guidance propelled the Beatles to their meteoric rise and global stardom. Known as the "fifth Beatle," Epstein ushered the scrappy Liverpool band from smoky backroom clubs to sold-out stadiums, but his brilliance was at times overshadowed by his own personal demons. Jacob Fortune-Lloyd (*The Queen's Gambit*) delivers an incredibly raw and authentic portrayal of Epstein, a world class disrupter long before anyone ever started using that terminology. Featuring a wonderfully nostalgic soundtrack and the kaleidoscopic backdrop of the Swinging Sixties in London, *Midas Man* delivers a wonderfully bittersweet portrayal of the man who made sure the entire world came to know the Beatles!



Ain't No Back to a Merry-Go-Round

In June of 1960, despite the obstacles of sweltering summer heat and the violence of American Nazi Party counterprotestors, a contingent of Black students from Howard University found themselves joined by white suburbanites, many of whom were Jewish to protest the segregated Glen Echo Amusement Park in Maryland. Emmy-award winning director Ilana Trachtman reveals the story behind this unlikely alliance which was the first organized interracial civil rights protest in US history. Featuring gripping historical footage and vivid firsthand testimonials her film highlights a little-known moment in US history. With narration by Jeffrey Wright and Mandy Patinkin, Ain't No Back to a Merry-Go-Round serves as a timely reminder of how far we've come and how far we still may have to go.

Facing ever-growing tensions between Jewish and Black Brooklynites and concerned about the future, a pair of spiritual leaders decide to embark on an experimental journey of interfaith exploration. Acclaimed filmmaker Ondi Timoner follows her sister, activist Rabbi Rachel Timoner, and her Congregation Beth Elohim as they partner with Reverend Dr. Robert Waterman and his Antioch Baptist Church, setting a course to attempt to heal centuries of racism and antisemitism in their communities. Shot over five years, the film reveals the struggles that threaten to drive the congregations apart—and it depicts their courage as they boldly share their truths and do what seems unimaginable in our current times. Both communities stay in the room, have difficult conversations, and listen to one another as they attempt to both understand and be understood. In the process, they become a shining example of what it means to truly honor and respect one another's differences.



Having emigrated to France with his family many years earlier, he reflects on his Sephardic upbringing as a child in a multicultural neighborhood of Jews, Muslims, and Christians. Born and raised in Pittsburgh, PA, Charles Grodin's amazing life is beautifully honored in director James Freedman's new documentary, Charles Grodin: Rebel with a Cause. Known for his sharp wit and incredible depth as an actor, Grodin is often remembered for his brilliant performances in The Heartbreak Kid and Midnight Run. A master in the art of deadpan, he delivered some of the most hilarious performances of his career during his numerous appearances on The Tonight Show with Johnny Carson and Late Night with David Letterman. But in an incredibly admirable twist, Grodin used his role as a CNBC talk show host to launch himself into the role of social activist. He became a fierce champion for prison reform and for the last twenty years of his life worked tirelessly to get several unfairly convicted women out of prison, many of whom were mothers of color with children at home. A true Pittsburgh hometown hero, his life story starts as a steady ripple of laughter that continues to rise only to surprise everyone and become a tidal wave of hope.





Winner of Israel's Ophir Award for Best Picture and their official selection for the Academy Awards for Best International Feature Film, Come Closer is a beautiful exploration of love, loss, and resilience. Lia Elalouf delivers a stunning performance in her feature film debut as Eden, a young woman who has been devastated by the sudden death of her younger brother, Nati. When Eden discovers that Nati had a secret girlfriend, she makes clandestine efforts to learn more and, in the process, embarks on a complicated journey of self-discovery. Inspired by director Tom Nesher's personal tragedy—the death of a younger brother—the film received 13 Ophir Award Nominations and, in addition to the Best Picture win, earned Nesher a Best Director Award, Elalouf a Best Actress Award, and editor Shauly Melamed an award for Best Editing. Come Closer was an official selection at both the prestigious Palm Springs International Film Festival and the Tribeca Film Festival where it won the Tribeca Viewpoints Award.

Zoe, a young British teen roaming the streets of Amsterdam and avoiding her mother's funeral, randomly meets and enlists the help of, Ruth, an Israeli woman avoiding her own wedding, to secure some hallucinogenic mushrooms. What ensues is one of the unlikeliest of buddy comedies as the two share a playful, psychedelic and unforgettable trip. Having formed an improbable connection, they wander the city together, escaping their troubles and sharing profound epiphanies all in the course of one wildly eventful and often otherworldly day. Featuring wonderfully endearing and hilarious performances by lead actors, Nell Barlow and Naama Amit, Day Trippers is a charming and whimsical slice-oflife dramedy that might be just what the "Green Doctor" ordered. Director Veronica Kedar's film is both grounded and nuanced and serves as an imaginative reminder that, with or without the help of hallucinogens, profound connections often happen when we least expect them.
